

### **Chaplain's Message**

 In celebrating 125 years of Faith in Action, the Knights have faithfully been pro-life with a consistent pro-life ethic. Pro-life issues do not simply concern abortion. They concern life from conception to natural death. Actually, all that we do is pro-life. We do things naturally which prolong our life. Even eating and exercise are pro-life activities which support our underlying desire for life. Whether we know it or not, we do things everyday which affirms our inborn quest for life. When we act for our own safety and the safety of others, we are acting to preserve life. Our scientific discoveries are the result of a desire to know more about God and about this life. Pope Benedict has recently encouraged our environmental stewardship as responding to the life which God has given us.

Being consistent means that we must be pro-life when it comes to the environment or nature, and pro-life when it comes to the human beings. We cannot be outraged over cruelty to animals but ambivalent about abortion, the taking of human life. Life is not ours to take or to decide when it will begin or end. The right to life is our most fundamental right. Catholic social teaching recognizes that all governments should protect the right to the dignity of each person which includes the right to life. Imagine a government which does not protect the life of its citizens. Sometimes, we can suffer from rationalization of truth and try to conform truth to socially accepted propositions, instead of the other way around. Embryonic stem cell research takes life and so cannot be supported even if it would mean a more comfortable life for us. The pro-choice industry will try to distort the truth and make it sound as if we are callous and not loving enough. But the opposite is true. It is an act of love to support the unborn.

The Knights' pro-life stance is especially needed as we witness an increase in violence and the number of murders. This increase shows a loss of respect for life and a choice to preserve one's own life at the expense of someone else's life- that's what abortion is.

Over the next months, I will include a brief review of the seven (7) major themes of Catholic Social Teaching. Each of these themes is rooted in the Dignity of the Human Person and the obligation to respect life. Each month we will review one or more of these themes so that we can have a better understanding of the Church and how it addresses current social issues. Each theme is founded on the truths of the Church to protect life and human dignity.

God is the giver of life. We are thankful for organizations such as the Knights which support life and help preserve a society which is a witness to the love of Jesus Christ. The work of the Knights continues to be a beacon for life. The unborn offer their silent gratitude every day.

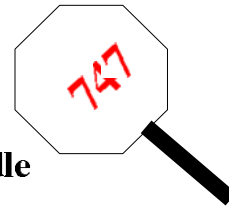
