

Chaplain's Message

 A fundamental theme of Catholic Social Teaching is the dignity of the human person. It recognizes that all people are sacred and are made in the image and likeness of God. There is no category of people who can be excluded from our love. People do not lose their dignity because of their disability, economic status, age, race or belief. Each person is a unique and unrepeatable human being created and loved by God and is entitled to be treated with respect.

The Church calls upon the governments of all nations to respect the dignity of each human life as their first obligation. The right to life is our fundamental civil right and should be respected and protected by all governments.

In order to more fully appreciate our pro-life stance, we have to recognize God's call to love all people without distinction. God loves us all equally, the same, and all the time. As images of God, we should reflect that love to all people all the time. In Christ, no one is alienated. Even those who do not respect us are entitled to our respect even though it is especially difficult to respect those who disrespect us. Yet, Christ said love your enemies and this love includes respecting the dignity of others regardless of their disposition toward us.

As we witness violence around the world, we see the effect which a lack of respect for human life can bring. This not only includes individual crimes but human rights abuses and genocide. They stem from a lack of respect for the life of another. Without respect for human dignity, the atrocities which we hear about and see become a way of life. It is respect for the dignity of each person which leads to justice which leads to peace. We continue to pray for peace on earth just as the angels did at the birth of Jesus Christ.

While we pray for world peace, we also pray for peace in our relationships. Respect for one another affects not just broad social issues but life within the community and the

family. Speaking to each other with respect and courtesy needs to remain a part of our family and community life. Next month we will reflect upon how the family is the central social institution which must be supported and strengthened.

In respecting life, Knights respect the dignity of each person. This includes the born, the unborn, the disabled, the elderly, the poor, and those disenfranchised by society. Father Michael McGivney, ordained a priest in 1877 by Cardinal Gibbons at the Basilica in Baltimore, was a model of respect toward all. With 13,000 Councils and 1.7 million members, the Knights, after 125 years, continue to respect life. The motto "in service to one, in service to all" reflects recognition of the dignity of all human life and the love of all people without distinction.

As we prepare for Advent, we are grateful that God respects human life. When we celebrate the fact that God became a human being, we become aware of God's respect for the human race and for each of us individually. In contrast to organizations around the world which promote violence and revenge, the Knights continue to respect one another and to represent a respect for our sacred life. Thanks be to God!

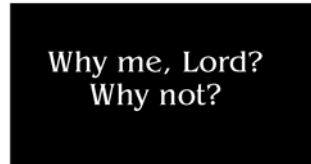
