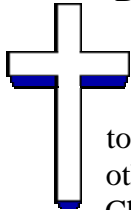

Being known in our Catholic Schools is key to having a strong presence in our Catholic community. I would like to see our Council running one program for each class in John Carroll and develop a similar effort for St. Margaret's schools.

Our officers are committed to this change but we need the help of every Knight and Knight's Lady of our great council to make this successful. I need your support to make this happen - participate. Can I count on you? We are all called to serve. Together we can make our Council successful this year and for the next 50 years.

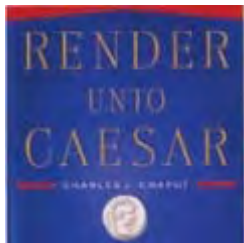

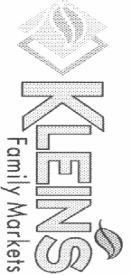

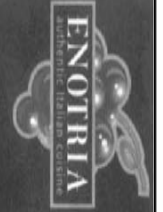
